What have we been learning this week?

Welcome back to everyone in Reception. It was lovely to see all the children and find out about their holiday news. This week the children have been getting back into the school routine. We now have rainbow challenges both inside and outside the classroom which the children love doing. In Maths we have been learning to match objects to numbers using numeral, magnetic numbers and numericon. In phonics this week we have been learning ll, ff, ss and J. We have learnt new tricky words including 'put' and 'pull'. In Literacy and Global Learning our book has been 'Hello world'. The children have learnt to say hello in different languages, and we have spoken and written about where our families are from. In fine motor we have been tapping pegs with a wooden hammer into pumpkins. We have been making potions and writing recipes. We are looking forward to another fun week next week.

<u>Key Stage 1</u>

Year 1:

Welcome back to Term 2, it was so lovely to see the children's smiley faces on Tuesday. This week we have started the traditional tale called "Little Red Riding Hood" and have been learning about the main components of a narrative. This has included learning about the typical setting, the main characters and the plot with a beginning, middle and end. The children absolutely loved Hot-Seating and pretending to be Little Red Riding Hood and the Big, Bad Wolf. In Phonics we have started learning some alternative sounds and new tricky words. Please look in your child's bookbag for detailed information about this and the opportunity to practice at home. Reading at home really makes a difference and consolidates learning in Class. In PSHE we celebrated the similarities between one another and shared our ideas. We are learning about the Nativity story in RE. We shared why gifts that had been given to us were important. We started our Science topic this week, 'Animals including Humans' and learnt about different types of pets. Today we start our first DT lesson so we look forward to telling you about that next week. Please remember to send homework books and reading records on Monday, library books are changed on Fridays.

Year 2:

What a warm welcome to our second half-term despite the dark, cold weather! We kickstarted our English learning with a new text called Malala's Magic Pencil based on the life of Malala Yousufzai. We created a story map with actions and discussed how we would use our own magic pencils to improve the world. This links well to our global learning theme – human rights. In Maths, we consolidated our 'addition and subtraction' knowledge with an end of unit assessment. Year 2 have been focusing on completing more maths mastery tasks – linked to our favourite characters, numberblocks! For Science, we are learning about 'Animals including Humans' and learnt about needs of different animals such as food, drink, shelter and oxygen. In PSHE, we are focusing on celebrating our differences. For Phonics, some pupils are catching up on phase three and five, whereas others are learning new graphemes linking to spellings. Thank you for your support with phonics. What a lovely end to the week learning about upcoming events like Remembrance Day and Diwali. We look forward to creating arts and crafts linked to these events. Please remember to send homework books and reading records for Monday.

<u>Key Stage 2</u>

Year 3:

It has been lovely to see everyone back after the half term break!

This week in English we have started to read our new text 'Henry's freedom box'. The book is based on the true story of a man who escaped slavery by mailing himself in a wooden crate to a free state. The children have begun identifying features of a diary entry and have explored a variety of texts to support with their learning. In maths we have continued with addition and subtraction focusing on exchanging tens and hundreds. We have continued to use place value charts and the column method to support with our learning. In History, we also looked at a new text called 'my little book of big freedoms' This is a book about human right which ties in with our global learning theme. Our project outcome in History

is to create our own big book of little freedoms so the children created and designed their own artwork for the book. This term's science topin is animals including humans. The children looked at similarities and differences in food that humans and animals eat and why we need food to survive. They explored the 5 main food groups and created their own school dinner posters containing foods that would be good for us to maintain a healthy and balanced diet.

Year 4:

It has been great seeing everyone back after half term! Once again Year 4 have had a very busy week. In English we have started to read our new book 'A Story Like the Wind'. This a story all about a young boy, Remi, who had to leave his home contrary to escape war. This has sparked some fantastic discussions this week about why people might need to leave their home contrary and why people need to seek asylum. In Maths we have continued our topic off addition and subtraction. We are looking forward to starting our new topic of measurement next week. We have started a new topic this week in Science of Animals and humans. This week we have focused on the digestive system and learnt about all the organs involved in the digestive system. We have started Art this half term, our topic is Sketching. This week we learnt about the artist Adonna Khare, who is know for her large-scale carbon sketches inspired an fusion of nature and the crazy need of everyday life. We created our own drawings inspired by Adonna Khare's work.









Year 5:

It has been lovely to see everyone back in year 5 after a restful half term! We kicked off the week with an introduction to our new inspiring text in English – Ada's violin. We created our own musical instruments from recyclable materials, just like Ada does in our book. We used these to create a fabulous display in our year 5 area. In maths we have continued our topic of multiplication and division through challenging ourselves to understand cube numbers – including a whole class investigation into cube numbers. In history this week we have been continuing our topic of Mayans and evaluated the stories of their many Gods and Goddesses. Finally, we would also like to show the amazing display created by the year 5 artwork last term – painting planets to show emotions.



Year 6:

Year 6 have busily carried out assessments this week in maths, reading and SPaG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar). The children should all feel very proud of themselves for the resilience and commitment they have demonstrated throughout the week. In art we have focused on our final drawing piece, pulling together all we have learnt so far this term on texture, scale and proportion, perspective and shading. We look forward to sharing the artwork with you very soon. During our PSHE lessons we considered prejudice and discrimination and how our perception of 'normal' fits into this. We've started sharing the book 'You are awesome' by Matthew Syed shifting from being 'kid average' to 'kid awesome.'
