What have we been learning this week?

Reception:

Paddington and Elmer classes have settled in very nicely this week in class and have started learning the routines eg. checking in with adults with their emotions in the morning, washing hands before snack time, washing hands after toileting and eating our lunch in the lunch hall. This week we have started doing Phonics and have learned 4 sounds already – s a t p. The children have started sounding out and blending letters and words using their newfound phonics knowledge. With their Maths and Global Learning, we have started learning all about ourselves and people in the community who help us. It would be great if families at home discussed all the different people who help us in our community eg. Teachers, nurses, doctors, fire fighters, police, cleaners in school, train and bus drivers etc. With behaviour, all Reception children have been working hard to show that they are 'ready' for learning in line with our behaviour policy and showing that they are being respecful and playing safely.

Key Stage 1

Year 1:

We have had a really busy week in Year 1. In Maths we have been learning about numbers that come 'before' and numbers that come 'after'. We are getting so good at counting forwards and backwards to 20! In English, we learned that nouns can be 'people, places and things' and that adjectives are describing words. We've also been practicing using capital letters and full stops in our writing. Next week, we will have a chance to write our very own narrative by applying all the skills that we have learnt so far. In History, we explored a 'family tree' and had great discussions about our families. In PSHE we learned that our teachers and school make us feel special and safe! In Computing, we have learned about what 'technology' is and how it helps us in our every day lives. In music we have been moving to the beat of Hip-hop.

Year 2:

This week in English, Year 2 explored the features of a narrative and focused on writing skills like expanded noun phrases, using commas and synonyms. In Maths, the pupils explored various ways to partition two-digit numbers using part whole models and dienes; they then focused on writing numbers to 100 in words. It would be fantastic if they continued to practise this skill at home. For Whole Class Reading, the pupils explored a poem, a fact file and continued reading George's Marvellous Medicine focusing on comprehension skills like summarising, inference and predictions. We had our first Geography lesson in Year 2 learning about the United Kingdom and using a map and compass. We used Google Earth to navigate the four countries in the UK and look at Reading! In Science, we are learning about animals including humans and this week we learnt about the different types of habitats such as ocean, rainforest and urban. Year 2 worked hard to achieve our whole school behaviour target for this week which was 'being ready' - we hope to see this continue! <u>Key Stage 2</u>


Year 3:

This week the children have continued to show how ready they are for school and learning. In English this week we have begun to explore our text 'The patchwork path'. We have used the text to support us with recognising and adapting writing in the first, second and third person. Next week we will begin looking at features of a narrative. In math, we have continued working on place value. We have been recognising what 10's and 100's look like and how they can be represented using objects and base 10. We have been recapping our 2's, 5's and 10 times tables, next week will start practising our 3's. In Geography this week we looked at the United Kingdom and the countries that make up Great Britain and the U.K. We used Atlas's to help us complete our own maps. In Spanish, we have been learning how to greet each other and find out how we are. The children enjoyed holding a simple conversation and responding in Spanish. In Art we have started to create our own patchwork quilt designs ready to design and paint in the coming weeks.

Year 4:

We have started to look at the skills set for the diary entrees we are making in English and have really started to get into our book "The Abominables."

In Maths we are still learning about place value and making sure our knowledge is secure. We have also been starting our modules on Judaism, the Romans and what is currently happening in the world such as the conflict in Ukraine. We cannot wait to properly get into the topics next week and start our project of making bread.



Year 5:

This week in year 5 we have been exploring skills needed to create amazing diary entries – including writing in the first person, past tense and using time conjunctions. In maths we have looked at numbers up to one million using a number line. We have learnt about the Mayan civilisation and the time period it existed. We have compared this to important periods in Britain and the rest of the world. In RE we conducted an investigation into Sikhism and produced our findings. In PE we have continued our learning from Year 4 with tag rugby.


Year 6:

This week in English the children were introduced to our WAGOLL narrative (what a good one looks like) inspired by our text the Lion and the Unicorn. We spent time discussing and identifying year 6 writing features within the WAGOLL which will support our own narratives next week. We also focused on writing skills such as prepositional phrases and using commas for lists. In maths we compared and ordered integers (whole numbers) and we consolidated learning using negative numbers. In humanities the children were introduced to our global theme for the term which is peace and conflict. We had our first year 6 geography lesson where the children identified located and described the location of the Congo National Park and in Science we conducted experiments creating shadows looking at how light travels.

Today all of our children heard from their class teacher about the Student Leadership Team which is a significant part of our vision and commitment to students. We have high aspirations for our children

and believe that developing them as leaders plays a crucial role in community transformation and improving their life skills. We aim to give students the confidence and oracy skills needed to navigate themselves later in life as well as the skills needed to lead and promote positive change within their own communities.

The student leadership team will equip all students with the skills, abilities, and qualities to pursue a fulfilling career, contribute positively to their communities and be an active global citizen. Student Leaders form an integral part of the Civitas Voice process. The teams will have the opportunity to meet regularly with the Leadership Team Leader and effect real change within our school.
