


Welcome to our new families who have joined us in Reception and in other year groups this year and a welcome back to all our Civitas community. Our children are settling in really well, getting to know new staffing teams and learning the routines for making school as successful as it can be.

We have really appreciated our families' support in ensuring we continue to keep safe as we continue with our one-way system at collection time; we're definitely not going to be able to have over 800 people on the playground at any one time!

In the morning the gates open at 8:40 to support safe entry and close at 8:55 when children are expected to be in their classes ready to start the school day. At the end of the day, we welcome our families onto the playground to collect the children using the one-way system and have kept the square in the middle of the playground for families collecting siblings. Reception, Year1 and Year2 finish at **3:15pm** and Years 3, 4,5, and 6 at **3:25pm**. We will continue to take feedback from staff, families, and our residents as to how this is impacting safety around the school and our local area.





#### Parking outside school

We recognise there is limited parking near school, and this can become frustrating both for yourselves and our residents. It may be that families need to park further away from the school entrance and walk down to the gates. To keep everyone safe you must NOT double park or park in front of the entrance gate on Hodsoll Road. We have asked for additional support from our local PCSOs, so our children, staff and families continue to stay safe.

#### Lunches

# What have we been learning this week?

#### Reception

What a lovely start we had in Reception! We are very proud of how resilient the children have been settling into class. We have been focusing on helping the children to settle into class and learn the class routines. While we have not started our 'formal' teaching yet, we have been reading stories, sang some songs, playing in all the different areas and have been discussing our class rules to make sure the children keep safe. Today was also the first time the children had lunch at school, and it was great to see how lovely they were able to form a line already to walk to the lunch hall together. We are also happy to welcome Miss Constantinescu, who started as an LSA in Elmer class this week.

## Key Stage 1

We would like to introduce new members of staff to the key stage 1 team. Miss Cole is the class teacher in Matilda class. She has loved getting to know the children so far this week. Miss Robinson is a Schools Direct student supporting Mrs Aram in BFG class. Mrs De Souza is now a HLTA supporting EYFS, KS1 and Year 3.

#### Year 1:

Year 1 have started settling in well this week. They are beginning to learn the new routines of the day, develop some independence with finding resources and getting their home things by themselves. In Maths, we are building upon learning in EYFS by sorting and counting objects. In English, we have started reading the book Beegu and the children have already started remembering words, phrases and actions from the story. In art, we have been learning about different colours and finding these around the room.



#### Year 2:

Year 2 have loved being back at school. In maths, they are starting with place value to 100. They are using resources to show the tens and ones of different numbers. In English, they are using the book 'Angus Rides the Goods Train' to write a narrative. They have identified the features of a narrative and listened carefully to the story to see if what happened matched their predictions. They have started the book 'George's Marvellous Medicine' for their whole class reading text. Their English books links to their global learning theme 'Identity and Diversity'. See if your child can retell one of the stories they have done so far this week.

#### **Key Stage 2**

#### Year 3:

Mrs Fuchs and Miss Fitchett have been delighted to see how enthusiastic everyone is to start Year 3. We have had a great start to the new school Year and it has been lovely to welcome some new faces too.

This week the children have been doing lots of 'get to know the teacher' activities, they really enjoyed the teacher quiz where they had to guess information about their new teacher.

In English we have been working on our presentation and re-capping some important key features of our writing. In math's we have been looking at place value and partitioning numbers, we have enjoyed using the math's resources to support our learning. Today's science lesson




was interesting for us all as we learnt about the difference between light and dark. We closed all of the blinds in the class and turned off the lights to see how our windows provide us with such a great light source. We have started guided reading lessons of the Iron Man, where we started learning how to use a dictionary.

#### Year 4:

Mrs Hargrave Hammond and Mr Williams have been very impressed with how ready all the year 4 children have returned to school ready to learn, after their summer holidays! This term in Humanities, we are going to be learning about Peace and Conflict and comparing the United Kingdom to other countries within Europe. We will also be looking at how the Roman Empire had a huge impact on modern day Britain. In maths we have started our place value unit where the children are getting back into the swing of working with numbers and are re-capping working with ones, tens, hundreds and thousands. In English we have read our new book, 'The day war came' which is all about a young girl who had to leave her own country due to the outbreak of war. We will be writing a narrative and have investigated these features. Over the next week, we will be investigating the features of a narrative to help us write our own! Our whole class reading book this half term is The Abominables and we will be looking at Sound during our Science lessons.

#### Year 5:

A very warm welcome to all our new starters. Staff-wise, we welcome Miss Burr (teacher of Avery class) and Ms Essien who joins us as a Learning Support Assistant. This term our Global Learning theme is Sustainable Development; we've recapped our previous learning and cannot wait to get started as we will be producing a public announcement. In maths we learnt our Roman numerals up to 1,000 and heard a very catchy tune! We've also been recognising numbers up to 1 million. In English, we've started to read The Boy Who Harnessed the Wind and will be building up to writing a diary entry in a couple of weeks. We were so excited to start the topic with a wind power challenge – look at what we produced!!







Our new science topic is Earth and Space. This week we learnt that the Earth, Sun and Moon are spherical in shape along with their relative sizes. We feel very proud of all the children who have returned to school ready to learn and have demonstrated their best versions.

The whole class reading will start next week with our book Goodnight, Mr. Tom and continue our topic on Light in Science. As this is the first week back, we have been getting settled and starting our new responsibilities in Year 6.
