Dear Parents and Carers,

This week has been a wonderful reminder of the great generosity we have amongst our school community. We have received emails of support offering to pay for the disco or school trips for some of our pupils who may not be able to attend those events or trips due to their current family circumstances; **THANK YOU.**

YOU have really prompted us to think how we can continue to work 'hand in hand' to support each other, our admin team are looking at the options on TUCASI to see how additional donations could be made into your Year group to support some of our children on future trips and events. We will send out more information about how this could be done after the Easter break. Thank you so much for this act of kindness.

Ramadan - Ramadan is considered the holiest month of the year for Muslims. This month-long celebration commemorates Allah, the Arabic name for God, giving the first verses of the Quran, the Muslim holy book, to the Prophet Muhammad in the year 610 A.D.

In Ramadan, Muslims fast from food and drink during the sunlit hours as a means of learning self-control, gratitude, and compassion for those less fortunate. Ramadan is a month of intense spiritual rejuvenation with a heightened focus on devotion, during which Muslims spend extra time reading the Qur'an and performing special prayers.

While children are not required to fast until they reach puberty, we recognise that some of our families may want some of our older children to perform limited or symbolic fasting such as fasting the occasional half day or on weekends. Ramadan is due to start this weekend with Eid UI-Fitr likely to be celebrated on Monday 2nd May, if you wish your child to participate in fasting at any time during our Holy month, this must be put in writing first to myself and emailed to office@civitasacademy.co.uk

Our Muslim scriptures tell us that fasting should not affect our normal daily life, and at Civitas we will obviously want to be sensitive to any of our pupils who may be fasting. Given that the obligation to fast does not override health considerations, a pupil who feels unwell, or feels faint can be offered water if judged appropriate by a qualified first aider or if the pupil requests it. If we are at all concerned about your child, we will of course call home. Spaces will be available during lunchtime for those that may be fasting to be together.

What have we been learning this week?

Reception

This week in Maths, we have been revisiting and extending some of the learning done this term. The children have been describing the characteristics of 3D shapes. They looked at shapes to construct and identified which are good for building, and which aren't as well as which shapes stack and which shapes roll and why that is. In Literacy we have been reading the book 'Sharing a Shell' by Julia Donaldson. The children have been writing about the characters in their books, and we have been discussing how the three creatures found a way to get along. We talked about how sharing looks like in our classes and how it feels if our friends share with us. In our creative area, we have been using celery to dip in paint to create patterns on our fish. We also used watercolour paint to make underwater animals.

Key Stage 1

Year 1: This week in English we have been learning how to write in the past tense and in the third person. We learned about the features of a newspaper report, planned and then wrote, a newspaper article about the penguin from the story 'Lost and Found'. In Maths we have been recapping subtraction, using a number line to jump back. In computing we learnt to compare groups and in Science we investigated waterproof materials. In History we compared Victorian toys with modern day toys.

Year 2: This week, the children have been learning the skills they will need in order to write a setting description next week linked to our story 'The Little House'. They have learnt how to use similes and comparative vocabulary to make their writing more engaging. In maths, the children have consolidated their multiplication and division learning as well as tackling complex number sentences where they have to do the inverse operation to find missing numbers. In art the children used their string and cardboard printing blocks that they made last week to paint and print. In history and global learning, the children read the book 'The Journey' and learnt about the right to asylum and the right to freedom of movement.

Next week, on **Wednesday 6th April**, year 2 would like to invite their parents in at **2:45pm** for a fundraising party! The children have been learning about food and nutrition and our project outcome is to volunteer within our school community. Therefore, the children wanted to make party food and share it with you. We are also partnering with the year 6s on their entrepreneurial task to fundraise for DEC who have an appeal for Afghanistan and Ukraine. There will be donation buckets available in order to raise money for this charity. Please enter via the front office so that we can sign you in.

Key Stage 2

Year 3: In Maths, we have been converting measurements. We converted millimetres to centimetres and vice versa, as well as converting centimetres to metres and vice versa. We added and subtracted different measurements and ensured we converted the measurements when doing so. In English, we have read "The Patchwork Path" by Betty Stroud. This has tied in nicely with our History work on the Underground Railroad. We have explored the features of narrative writing by reading texts and noting the consistencies. Direct speech and past tense are two of the features of narrative writing that we have explored in more depth this week. In RE, we explored the importance of the cross and the resurrection in Christianity. In science, we have been learning about how fossils were formed. We looked at a real ammonite from Madagascar as well as a primitive marine fish found in the Atlas Mountains. There was much excitement when our spiral clay pots returned after being bisque fired in a kiln. We painted them with acrylic paints of our choice and decorated them with a pattern.



Year 4: Year 4 have had such a fantastic week! In maths, we have worked hard to complete our decimals. To start, we looked at multiplying and dividing decimal numbers by 10 and 100 and challenged ourselves to then write these as fractions. In English we have taken a deep dive into all the features needed for a news report. The children have started to use inverted commas and modal verbs. They also learnt the difference between a fact and opinion – a much needed skill in news report writing. The rest of our week has been spent preparing for our protest march. The children were fantastic role models for our school and clearly loved marching while protesting to raise awareness of extinction. Now the march is complete, the children have been part of making a mini documentary which will be shared once it has gone through its final publication process! We are immensely proud of the children and the way they have engaged with this topic and the effort they have put in to making the documentary and their posters – a big well-done year 4!

On Friday 29th April, we are taking our exciting trip to The Living Rainforest! Please make sure to fill in the Microsoft forms to give consent for your child to join the trip.



Year 5: In maths this week we started our new unit on decimals and percentages. Initially we looked at decimals up to 2 decimal places then considered decimals as fractions followed by understanding thousandths. We were surprised to learn that there are one hundred thousandths in a tenth! In preparation for Shakespeare Day next Thursday, we have been reading one of Shakespeare's plays - Macbeth; we had great fun hot seating Macbeth and Lady Macbeth questioning them about the murders of King Duncan and Banquo. We can't wait to see everyone dressed up on Shakespeare Day.

In PSHE we are continuing with our topic of Healthy Me and have looked at how the media can affect our ideas of body image. We couldn't believe some of the fake and photoshopped images on the internet. Our tote bags are beginning to take shape as we carefully considered our design, colour and wording to challenge stereotypes.

Don't forget that we will be sharing this terms learning as well as selling our tote bags and cakes after school on Tuesday. We look forward to seeing you in school then! Children can also dress-up for Shakespeare Day in anything Shakespeare related.

Year 6: In Maths this week, the children have continued to develop their understanding of ratio and proportion and applied it to some SATs style questions. They have worked incredibly hard on this topic and it has been great to see them sharing their thoughts and understanding with one another.

In literacy, the children have been exploring levels of formality and how, as authors, they can control this to manipulate the audience. This is a real skill and one that the children have enjoyed applying to their written work. It has allowed them to show their own personality in their writing. Next week, they will be completing their final piece of written work for the half term.

It was lovely to see so many of you on our parents evening call this week and I know we discussed our recent Mock SATs week and how the children had got on. We also explained that their will be a SATs evening this coming Monday which you will have received an email about earlier in the week. It would be great if you can attend and feel free to ask any questions.


