What have we been learning this week?

Reception:

We had a very short week in Reception this week, as we have only been in for 2 days! On Tuesday we read the text; Bee: Nature's tiny miracle. It's about a little bee and it's journey from flower to flower and it teaches the children about pollination. In our literacy lessons, we have been learning about the life cycle of bees, and that we have three different types of bees. The queen bee, the drone bee and the worker bee. We learned why bees are very important to help plants grow, and that they are pollinators. The children have been looking at different parts of a plant. On Thursday, the children were all so excited to meet their new teachers during transition morning!

Key Stage 1

Year 1: It has been a busy week in Year 1 despite being a four-day week! In English, we explored the features of advertisements (not just Youtube videos!) and discussed what makes them persuasive. This has helped us to plan our own advertisements based on 'The Beeman' to persuade people to buy honey related products. In Maths, we continued counting and comparing coins and notes and then applied our knowledge to complete the end of unit assessment. As part of our Science learning, we identified and classified different types of leaves based on their shape, size, texture and veins. In PSHE, we reflected on what we have learnt and how we have grown this past year. We discussed how we will continue to blossom in Year 2. On Thursday, we met our new teachers during transition morning – it was exciting to get a glimpse of Year 2, exploring the new corridor and classrooms!

Year 2: This week Year 2 have written their biographies in English. The children have written these using a wide range of vocabulary and punctuation. The children have worked hard on these and they have added some interesting facts about Wangari. In Maths, the children have been looking at position and direction. The children have been looking at half turns, three quarter turns and quarter turns. The children have been looking at patterns with shapes and predicting which way the shape will be in the next pattern.

In Science, the children have recapped life cycles and have looked at which animals lay eggs to which animals give birth the same as humans. The children have really enjoyed this and have enjoyed making their own animal life cycle. In whole class reading the children have continued to read Fantastic Mr Fox and they have been working on their inference and retrieval skills.

All the children had great fun at our sports day and every child took part. If you were able to come and watch, thank you very much!

Key Stage 2

Year 3: In Math we are continuing with the unit Shape. We have recognised and described 3-D shapes. We even made 3-D shapes. We understand what vertices, faces and edges are and can identify them on 3-D shapes. We did our end of unit assessment on shape. In English we used our understanding of features and purposes of a motivational speech to create a WAGOLL and plan for our own motivational speech. We absolutely adore Kid President! He is such an amazing motivational speaker and so very funny! In Humanities we started looking at how certain events happened as they did in ancient history. And the importance of the river Nile. In Spanish we continued to learn how to read and write various animals names, we also used un or una in front of the correct word. In Science we have started revising our past learning about the humans and animals with some interesting starters to make us think!

Year 4 and Year 5

Year 4 and Year 5 had a great time during Thursday's transition morning- meeting their new teachers and visiting their classrooms. We can't wait to see them flourish as our new Upper Key stage 2 children in September!

<u>Year 6:</u> Year 6 enjoyed a multi-sport event with Mr Khaliq on Thursday morning. They were working in teams and challenging themselves using a range of equipment. We have continued preparing for our show- 'Shakespeare Rocks!' and the children have done a great job learning their lines, songs and some dance moves! In History, we looked at the development of Anglo-Saxon settlements in England and created timelines to display their learning.
