What have we been learning this week?

Reception:

In Reception, we have been reading "The Rainbow Fish", a story about the importance of being kind and sharing. Our learning challenges have been inspired by the lovely story, the children have become published authors of their own retelling of the story of "The Rainbow Fish" and have used various materials to create a collage for the front cover. In Maths we have been looking at height and length and exploring the vocabulary used to compare objects according to size. In phonics we have been consolidating our understanding of phase 3 sounds (ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, oo, or, ar, ur, ow, oi, ear) and have been focusing on building fluency while reading.

Thank you to everyone who puts pictures of learning you have done at home on Tapestry, the children have really enjoyed sharing their experiences with their peers.

<u>Key Stage 1</u>

Year 1:

In Year 1 we have been been reading the book, "My Two Grannies" by Floella Benjamin. We have identified and used verbs in our writing and planned and wrote a fact file about an older person as part of our global learning theme of "Social Justice". In Maths we have learnt to find the difference between two numbers and work out missing numbers by using a numberline (eg. 13 - $_{-}$ = 2 or $_{-}$ + 4 = 17). In Science we are investigating plants and this week the children were very excited to plant their own bean which they will document over the next few weeks before they bring it home. In RE we are learning about Palm Sunday and this week we considered how we would welcome someone special into our life. For History we considered the life and contributions to society of Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole. The children completed a venn diagram to show the similarities and differences between the two nurses. In Computing we are learning about data this term. This week we learnt the importance of labelling and grouping objects to simplify our world. In PSHE this term we are learning how to have a healthy life and focused this week on food and sleep in particular. In DT we started to investigate bridges in preparation for us creating our own bridges later in the term!

Year 2:


What a lovely start to the second half of our Spring term! In English, we have began to read our new text called "Yasmin's Hammer" which links to our global learning theme of 'peace and conflict'. The pupils have loved reading this text and learning new words in 'bengali/bangla' as the text is set in Bangladesh – also the same language that Mrs Alim speaks! In Maths, we recapped our knowledge of the x2 and x10 times tables to support us with division number sentences; along with a focus on doubling, halving and odd and even numbers. In Computing this half term, Year 2 are learning about the importance of data collection – this week's learning was based around tally charts. As part of our science unit, we are learning about plants, so we investigated a range of seed packets and compared the instructions and labels. For Humanities, Year 2 explored and discussed the changes over time since free education was introduced by Dr Barnardo. In PSHE, our unit of learning is about "being healthy" relating to a healthy body and a healthy mind. This week, we discussed how different emotions affect our mental health then explored coping strategies to help us feel better.

<u>Key Stage 2</u>

Year 3:


This week we have been identifying and exploring a range of recounts and narratives in English. We began reading our new text 'The first drawing' which over the next three weeks, we will explore further with an outcome of writing a recount of the story. In maths we have been learning about measurement of length and perimeter of shapes and objects. We have used lots of pictoral resources to support our learning. In P.S.H.E our new topic is 'Healthy me'. We discussed healthy diets and lifestyles and what we can do to keep our selves balanced with our eating habits and our physical activities. We set ourselves challenges of physical activities we can do now and set ourselves goals of where we would like to be.

In History we have continued learning about the Stone Age. We explored the history of drawing and cave paintings. We created our own cave paintings which we hope to show to parents at an Oracy story telling presentation nearer the end of term.



Year 4:

We welcomed back our Year 4s this week with some brand-new topics. We are focusing on art this half term and looking into the works of William Morris who was a printer 200 years ago and has come up with some classic wallpaper designs still used today! We will be creating our own design by carving into potatoes and printing on sheets of paper. In Science this half term, we are learning about states of matter and if they can change. This will lead on to the water cycle and how water can change states and what effect that has on the planet.



This term, our project outcome is Identity and Diversity and we have been investigating hidden disabilities. Our focus has been on mental well-being and focusing on events and charities that can help people with this throughout their lives. Later in the term, we will invite you to join Year 4 for a well-being workshop they will host along a Bake Sale. We will be raising money for a charity about mental well-being.

Year 5:

Year 5 have had a brilliant first week into this half term. We have started this half term with our Maths and English assessments, all of year 5 have shown a great attitude towards these assessments. In the afternoons, we have continued our guided reading book 'The Jamie Drake Equation' and continued to practise our skills such as retrieval and inference and investigated the links between these skills. In History we have compared the lives of Spartans and Athenians and took on the roles to hold a class debate to discuss who should run Greece. In science we have begun our new topic of materials and explored the ways in which we could separate soluble and insoluble materials from water. We have held some fantastic in-class discussions this week and look forward to continuing this further throughout the rest of the Spring term.

Year 6:

This week in English the children have been focusing on diary writing skills. We have revisited using formal and informal language, time adverbials and using different tense forms. We will then be applying these skills to write our own diary entries inspired by the Wolves of Willoughby Chase (our whole class reading text) next week. In maths we learnt how to find percentages of amounts and completed our end of unit assessment on fractions, decimals and percentages. We had a very interesting lesson about the Great Plague in London in history. The children loved discovering facts about how the plague spread, its symptoms and the strange and shocking measures that people took to avoid getting sick. The children then applied their new knowledge and diary entry as if they were there at the time. In science we discussed characteristics and traits inherited from our parents and in D.T we made our basic hat structures using card.
