What have we been learning this week?

Reception:

In Phonics lessons this week we have continued our work on **same letter digraphs** (e.g. ladder, digger and rabbit) and extended to looking at longer words (e.g. boxer, lemon and laptop). Children have been focusing on their ascending and descending letters as well as exploring capital letters and full stops. This week we have been reading 'Martin Luther King', a child-friendly account of the historical figure and the impact he has had on the world. The children really enjoyed completing their Rainbow Challenges exploring part – whole models, writing about their dreams, sequencing events from Martin Luther King's life. In maths this week we have been focusing exploring the composition of numbers using addition, focusing on 6,7 and 8. Thank you to all the parents who have continued to read and post learning on Tapestry each week, we would love to see any activities you do over the half term. Any parents who need support to set up their eBooks and how to use Tapestry, please come and speak to the EYFS team and we will sit and help you! Thank you for your ongoing support, ke we are very grateful!

Key Stage 1

Year 1:

In English this week, we have written, illustrated and published our own stories based on our class text, Little Red Reading Hood and added an alternative ending. In Maths, we have been exploring doubles and near doubles by using ten frames. In addition, we have practiced using numberlines to subtract to 20. In Geography we learnt key facts about the traditions and culture in Scotland including the Highland Games, bagpipes and kilts! In Science, we completed a fun experiment to see which materials were waterproof and which were not. In Art we completed our final piece by completing an abstract self-portrait. In RE we learned about being a good friend even when things are difficult and made friendship bracelets for friends. As part of our 11B411 promises, we spent some time bird watching to achieve the promise of 'wildlife warrior'. Thank you to the children who completed the bird feeder challenge, they were truly wonderful. The children enjoyed sharing their designs with other classes. Thank you for listening to your child read regularly. Please can you keep up the wonderful reading over the holidays and record in the yellow Reading Record. This book is looked at by the Year 1 Teachers every Monday. Happy half term!





Year 2:

What a wonderful half term we have had in Year 2 - although it was only five weeks, we have been extremely busy! The pupils have finished writing their fact files and created lovely portraits of Thomas Barnardo. In Maths, they have been introduced to the division symbol focusing on sharing and grouping equally. In Science, we learnt about the term 'biodegradable' and explored different forms of recycling. In Geography this week, we investigated ariel maps and located famous landmarks of London on the map as well as the River Thames! In History, we discussed the differences between the lives of rich and poor families during the Victorian Era. Thank you to all the parents who have continued to read with your child and practise phonics, we would love to see any activities you do over the half term. <u>Key Stage 2</u>

Year 3:

I would like to say a huge well done to the children in year 3 who took part in their 11b411 Hiking heroes promise over the last 2 weeks. The children accomplished a fantastic 9 miles in 9 days! Unfortunately, we were unable to do our local walk for two days, but with the help of an activity tracker, the children were able to accumulate an average of almost 10,000 steps in one P.E lesson which took them over their 9mile target. This is a fantastic achievement, and we are proud of every child who took their hiking role seriously, was safe, responsible and respectful while out on our daily walks.



Year 4:

Year 4 have had a very busy week. In English we have been researching charities as part of our Goble Learning Theme, Identity and Diversity. We have focus our research on the Mind, Mental Health Charity and the Hidden Disability Sunflower Scheme. After researching we then planned, drafted, edited and published fact files about our chosen charity. In Maths we have started our new topic of length and perimeter. We started the week learning about meters and kilometers, and practices converting between these measurements. We ended the week learning about how to work out the perimeter of a shape, we are looking forward to continuing this learning after half term. In DT we have been working hard toward our project outcome to creating a quilt. Over this half term we have learnt about the history of quilting, we designed our own square and have been learning how to sew fabric together. This week we created our own patch of a quilt and work in groups to sew them together.







Year 5:

In English this week, we completed our final write and produced fact files all about life in Greece. We have used our research from our Global Learning lessons to fill our fact files with key information such as their food, national religion, traditions, history and lifestyle. We also included some physical and human features of Greece in our fact file. In our Maths lessons, we have been using our knowledge of fractions to find the whole and fractions of an amount. In art this week, we completed our photography unit by capturing images and creating a collage inspired by David Hockney. We were so impressed with our outcome. This week highlighted the importance of children's Mental Health, and we learned to voice out things that matter to us. On Tuesday, it was Internet Safety Day; we enjoyed watching videos and reading more about how to be safe online.

Year 6:

This week year 6 read a high-quality example of a diary entry and identified its features. In maths we learned how to find decimal, fraction and percentage equivalents; we can even order them! We enjoyed our geography lesson as we learnt more about the tundra biome including the wildlife that's found there, what the climate is like and what threatens its existence. As it was Safer Internet Day, we considered the positive and negative impact that influencers can have on us. In addition, we thought carefully about comments that we post online or in chat groups. For Children's Mental Health Week we drew a swirl and wrote, drew or stuck what matters to them inside of it. We are hoping we can create an eyecatching display with all the children's artwork.
