Dear Parents and Carers,

Even as we have approached this final week towards half term it has been jam packed with the buzz of learning and community spirit all around school. We had 'Stageability' in on Monday carrying out a drama workshop with some of our pupils. Our children have been spreading kindness with our community flowers that seem to be appearing all around Reading! We have been extremely proud of our older pupils this week who have been spending some time 'giving back' to our younger pupils be that through some writing work, reading activities, music or helping them with their pupil surveys. As part of our learning theme on human rights we have also had a speaker from Amnesty International talk to our children in Year 2 via TEAMs about the 'rights of the child.' I look forward to the children telling me all about this!

I wrote to our Year 4 parents on Wednesday to let them know that Miss Burbidge who started as a newly qualified teacher (NQT) with us in September 2020 during the global pandemic will be leaving us today. ## What have we been learning this week?

#### **Reception**

This week, the children have been continuing their learning about endangered animals. We have continuing to explore the book "The Rainforest Grew All Around", we have been focusing on the non-fiction writing in this book and the children have been expanding their knowledge of jungle animals. The children have enjoyed writing animal facts. In maths we have been looking at measuring objects and measuring time. The children have really loved exploring the different ways we can measure and have been trying hard to use the correct vocabulary to go with this.

The children had a fantastic time on Wellbeing Wednesday and did lots of activities relating to mental health and wellbeing. They have been sharing things that they are grateful for, talking about their aspirations for the future and sharing positive thoughts about themselves and their friends.



#### <u>Key Stage 1</u>

Year 1: This week, children have been working on writing their own version of the story 'A squash and a squeeze'. They have changed the characters and animals. It has been so exciting to see their wonderful ideas. In Maths, we have counted by 2's and 5's. In Science we looked at different ways to record weather, such as a thermometer and wind vane. In Gography we learned about the equator and what type of weather we can experience close to the equator and far away from the equator.

Well being Wednesday was an amazing day, filled with meditation and our 5 keys to happiness. We know have many tools to keep our minds and bodies happy!

Year 2: This week in English, year 2 have been writing recounts about "The Last Garden". The children have looked over their writing plans and checked all the features, before creating their draft write. We are looking forward to publishing and displaying our work around the school! In Maths, we have continued to be looking at 3D shapes and learning the correct vocabulary to support our learning. This week we were incredibly lucky to have Y6 come to visit us in year 2. The year 6's were able to help complete the Reach2 Survey alongside the children, support the children to purple pen their English work and even joined in during music lesson. During wellbeing Wednesday, we had many excited children come into school with their clothes inside out! During the day, we created our own kindness fortune tellers and followed a video on how to draw a sloth.



#### Key Stage 2

Year 3: In English, this week we have completed writing a persuasive letter about our concerns of human rights abuse. In English, we have used emotive writing, conjunctions, rhetorical questions, fronted adverbials as well as facts and concerns. This has been published in a traditional letter format. In Maths we have interpreted, used, and drawn the tally system and pictograms. On Wellbeing Wednesday, we created our own pictogram with questions that our friend answered, and we then marked. In Science we used our learning and understanding about the topic 'Plants' and identified whether food items our teacher brought was a root, stem, leaf, flower seed or a fruit. Broccoli was a surprise! We worked on our 'Big book of Big Freedoms.' In this we collected our paintings on human rights, descriptions, letters, glossaries, and list of school rules that protect our human rights.



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#### Year 4:


A lot has happened this Spring term and the children are looking forward to a well-deserved break to get rested and refreshed. On Wellbeing Wednesday the children have learned about and practised mindfulness and meditation; they have learned all about how this helps them regulate their emotions and feel calmer. This term the children have learnt many new things about sustainable development in their geography lessons; we have focused on looking after our oceans and rainforests. In English, their skills of writing a biography and a poem are coming along well – good effort Year 4! They have written about looking after our oceans and animals and their work is published and ready to be proudly displayed. The children have learnt to sew in D&T, explored and experimented with sound in science, learned fractions and how to work out the area in maths. The children crafted goodbye cards to Miss Burbidge to say thank you and good luck for the future. The children in Richards classed guessed who their new teachers would be before they were announced and then we discussed responding to changes and being adaptable. The children were very excited to hear they'll be making a documentary next term and after practising they're oracy skills a lot in all their lessons, I think they're ready for the challenge! Well done Year 4, you've worked very hard. Hope you keep safe and well during the storm. Enjoy the well-earned break!



#### Year 5:

This week in English we have been focusing on our English grammar skills and continuing to edit our argument over whether Women belong in STEM. Below is an example of a students work, it is coming along great! For Maths we are still working on our fractions and this week we saw the end of our Geography Topic on agriculture in Afghanistan.

Our well-being Wednesday was focusing on ideas that we could use to make use happier and other people happier. The students came with someone great ideas and hopefully this is something we can incorporate into our lessons.



We have been really lucky in Year 5 to have had Miss Burr teach us in Year 5 and today is her last day on placement! Thank you for all you have done for the staff and students Miss Burr. We hope to see you again soon!

#### Year 6:

We are so proud of what the children have achieved this half term. They have worked really hard and had a well deserved well-being Wednesday this week. The PTA cannot run without members of Civitas Academy having active roles to make sure the PTA runs smoothly.


We are looking for parents, carers and grandparents for the following positions.
