What have we been learning this week?

Reception:

It was lovely to see everyone back after half term. We continue to learn about endangered animals, and our focus this term will be on 'underwater animals'. We started this term with the text 'Somebody swallowed Stanley' by Sarah Roberts. This is a powerful story about plastic pollution. We learned about the ocean and its' creatures, and explored the issue of plastic and the damage it causes in the ocean. The children looked at how we can help to protect the ocean and reduce pollution. The children came up with ideas and we talked a lot about recycling. In literacy, we have been writing about the story, and in independent writing, the children have been writing about the different underwater animals. In math this week, our focus was on doubling. The children learned that double is twice as many. They found out by painting dots on one side of a butterfly and then to fold them. They predicted the amount of dots they would see by opening the butterfly again and count the amount of dots altogether. At the art table, the children have been creating pictures of different under the sea animals, and it was great to see so many different and colourful animals! We have been lucky that the weather was so lovely, so we have been choosing to do a lot of learning, like maths and writing outdoors.

Key Stage 1

Year 1: What a great start to our final half-term in Year 1! In English, we kickstarted the week reading a new text called 'Somebody swallowed Stanley" which lots of us remembered reading in Reception. We discussed new vocabulary and wrote questions for the main character, Stanley. It was fun to be in the 'hot seat' as Stanley and answer questions! Also, we learnt about how the author, Sarah Roberts, works closely with animals and the work that she does to help protect the environment. In Maths, we are learning about place value focusing on numbers to one hundred! We have learnt how to count in tens using a hundred square and used our prior learning to partition larger numbers into tens and ones. In PSHE, we explored the life cycle of humans, plants and animals discussing how changes can happen in shape, size and sometimes colour! As part of our new unit of learning in Science, we will be 'working scientifically' - this means that we will complete a new experiment every week! This week, we investigated density and tested how and why objects float or sink in water. On Thursday, we celebrated World Ocean Day, which is linked to our global learning theme, sustainable development. In class, we learnt about the different oceans, and discussed the damaging effects of plastic pollution in the sea. Plus, we created beautiful sea animal silhouettes using a technique called 'sponge paint'.





Year 2: This week year 2 have started this half term by starting their new book in English. This book is called Wangari's trees of peace. The children enjoyed acting out the book and acting as Wangari. The children have been hot seating and asking 'Wangari' questions. In maths, the children have started a new topic of measurement and mass. The children have been looking at how much fruit weighs and what the total mass of different objects is. In whole class reading, year 2 have started their new book Fantastic Mr Fox. All of year 2 have painted a fox and they look amazing! In history the children have been looking at the history of Reading. In PSHE, the children have looked at the life cycles of humans.



Key Stage 2

Year 3: In Maths this week we have continued learning about time. We have explored hours and minutes using durations, added and subtracted minutes and seconds after converting them. Learned about units of time and solved problems with time. In English we are starting to learn about playscripts. Year 5's came to read us the playscripts that they created last term. They even let us read their scripts. As we had started to identify the features of a playscript we could find these after seeing Year 5's creations. In Science we started to design our own boardgame using a magnet. Next week, we will build our design. Design and Technology involved the introduction of our new theme: I am in love with my car. We explored the mechanisms used to make a car move. We learnt about Henry Ford, monster trucks and formula one cars. We looked at the differences between a toy car and a real car. In Global learning we are learning about Power and governance in ancient Egypt. We created a timeline and placed historical events on it in the order they happened. We started to learn to read and say the vocabulary of various wild and domestic animals' names in Spanish.

Year 4: We have had a very busy week in Year 4. In Maths this week, we have started our new topic of Shape. We started our topic by learning about turns and understanding different types of angles, acute, obtuse, and right angles. Throughout the week we have also been working hard to make the final preparations for our Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) that will be taking place next week. We have continued our learning about The Windrush Generation as part of our Global Learning theme 'Social Justice in Equity' across a lot of our subjects this week. In English, we read the book 'Coming to England' a story written by Floella Benjamin based on her own childhood experiences of moving from Tobago at the age of 10 and how she build a new life in England. We also began to explore the features of a narrative and identified features within a text in preparation to write our narratives. In History, we begin to explore the question 'What was the Windrush?' We were amazed to find out that nearly half a million people made the life-changing journey from the Caribbean to the UK during the Windrush, to help support the UK economy after WW2. In Art, we further developed our knowledge about the Windrush and research the photographer Vanley Burke. Vanley moved to the UK at the age of 14 from Jamacia and began to document the life of Caribbean communities made moved to Birmingham.

Year 5: It has been great to have everyone back in class this week. We have been enjoying a fresh start to the term in the lovely weather. In English this week we have been recapping the narrative writing genre and preparing write our own narratives by exploring the features of a narrative from our WAGOLL based on the book Too Much Trouble by Tom Avery (who Avery class is named after!). In our global learning lesson this term we have been exploring the differences between the Victorian police force and the modern-day police force. We will be using the case studies discussed to write our narrative in English. In maths this week we have finished our topic of position and direction with developing an understanding of symmetry and reflection. We also started our new maths topic – decimal numbers – where we can use our learning of place value from the Autumn term to support us. We look forward to a fantastic final term in year 5!

Year 6: A warm welcome back to our year 6's who are now entering their final term here at Civitas Academy. The week kicked off with an exciting new project in maths, where the children applied their maths skills to plan a holiday. We explored looking at rainfall and temperature graphs, interpreting and analysing data. In writing we have started our final writing unit: balanced arguments. We began the week by identifying common features of balanced arguments and then we explored and 'boxed-up' our WAGOLL (what a good one looks like) which is linked to our new Saxon and Viking topic in humanities.
