What have we been learning this week?

Reception:

We had such a lovely week again in Reception! We had a great sports day, and it was nice to see that all the children had a good time. When we came back to class, we did some independent writing about our favourite part of sports day. In literacy this week, we read the text '10 Things I Can Do to Help My World', by Melanie Walsh. We have been learning about the ten things everyone can do to help conserve their world and have been writing and drawing about some of these ten things in our literacy books. We also discussed what other things we can do to help our world. At the funky finger table, the children used tweezers to pick the rubbish out of the ocean, as the children did not want the underwater animals to get stuck in the rubbish, or to accidentally eat the plastic. In our art area, we looked at our planet. The children used blue and green paper to create a picture of the Earth. In maths this week, we focused on spatial reasoning. We replicated simple constructions and models. The children also continued to sort numbers into odd and even. Today it is 'bend the rules' day, and it was great to see the children having so much fun!

Key Stage 1

Year 1: What an exciting week in KS1 filled with lots of learning, sports and a little rule-breaking! In English, Year 1 started exploring a new text called 'The Beeman' written by Laurie Krebs. We made predictions and shared ideas about who or what 'The Beeman' could be. In Maths, we have started learning about 'money', focusing on recognising notes and coins, then ordering them by value and size. As part of our Science learning, we investigated the importance of gravity and forces. We learnt about Galileo and his theory of air resistance, so we experimented dropping different objects from the same height. For RE, we continued our research about Judaism and how Rosh Hashanah is celebrated; we discussed different ways to show and seek forgiveness. Then, we designed our 'fingers of forgiveness' posters. Well done to Year 1 for trying their best on Sports Day and most importantly, having fun! A fantastic

end to the week with 'bend the rules' day - we had lots of fun!





Year 2: This week Year 2 have written their biographies in English. The children have written these using a wide range of vocabulary and punctuation. The children have worked hard on these and they have added some interesting facts about Wangari. In Maths, the children have been looking at position and direction. The children have been looking at half turns, three quarter turns and quarter turns. The children have been looking at patterns with shapes and predicting which way the shape will be in the next pattern.

In Science, the children have recapped life cycles and have looked at which animals lay eggs to which animals give birth the same as humans. The children have really enjoyed this and have enjoyed making their own animal life cycle. As a whole class the children have continued to read Fantastic Mr Fox and they have been working on their inference and retrieval skills.

All the children had great fun at our sports day and every child took part. If you were able to come and watch, thank you very much!

Key Stage 2

Year 3: Another fun filled busy week! We had such fun at our sports day with every child taking part. In Math we are continuing with the unit Shape. We have learnt about perpendicular and parallel lines; we can recognise and describe 2-D shapes. We also learnt how to draw polygons. In English we explored the features and purposes of a motivational speech. We identified how emotive language is used in motivational speech. In Humanities we finished a record of our experiences as an archeologist last week. In Spanish we continued to learn how to read and write various animals names, we also used un or una in front of the correct word. In Science we learnt about Marie Currie and how she invented the x-ray machine.

Year 4: We have had a very busy week in Year 4. In Maths, we have continued our topic of shape. We have explored polygons, quadrilaterals and lines of symmetry. Next week we will be moving onto a new topic of statistics. This week we have carried on our learning on the topic of the Windrush. This week marked the 75th Anniversary of the first time the HMT Empire Windrush Ship arrived at Tilbury Dock, bringing with it over a thousand people from The Caribbean, who were ready to start their new lives in England. In English, we planned, wrote, edited, and published our own narratives, based on the book 'Coming to England' by Floella Benjamin. In History, we explored the life of Evelyn Wauchope another member of the Windrush Generation. During Art, we have been inspired by Vanley Burke to use the iPad to capture photographs of our school community and learnt techniques to edit these images. In Science, we have set up a very exciting experiment to test our scientific question of 'Does sugary and acidic drinks cause damage to teeth?'. We are looking forward to seeing the result next week. We ended our week with an extra afternoon play time to celebrate everyone in Year 4 being awarded 'star of the week' for all of our hard work last week in our multiplication check. Well Done Year 4!








Year 5: In Year 5 this week we have been writing our final crime drama narrative and we have also started to move onto our new writing genre — instructions! To do this we have played the 'blind drawing game' where we were verbally instructing our peers to create a drawing and we have looked at the key features of instructional writing. In maths this week we have been adding and subtracting decimal numbers and used this knowledge to understand number lines with decimals. In DT we have begun to create our Victorian torture devices and will be using this as inspiration for our instructional writing. This week we finished reading our class novel — street child — and discussed the importance of the true story of Jim Jarvis. Year 5 really enjoyed Sports Day this week and every one of us put in our best effort. It was great to see the children working as a team and supporting each other.
