What have we been learning this week?

Reception:

In Reception this week we have been really busy. In Maths we have been learning about sets and thinking about when we have the same number. In Phonics we have now learnt s, a, t, p, i, n, m, d and starting to read words. In Literacy and Global Learning we have been learning about how to use a visual timetable and designing and agreeing to the classroom rules. Our new book we have been looking at in class is called 'All are welcome', this book is about everyone feeling welcomed and accepted. Our focus this week has been the children practising name writing and threading which works on their fine motor skills. The children have been drawing and painting pictures about their families and who is important to them. In P.E the children experimented with hula hoops which they all really enjoyed. Thank you so much to all the parents that attended the teacher meeting it was fantastic to see so many of you. If you were unable to attend the slides will be on the website.

Key Stage 1

Year 1:

This week we have been planning and writing our narratives based on the story 'Beegu'. We have been focusing on writing sentences that make sense, applying our phonics knowledge and basic punctuation. We are now budding authors and immensely proud of our achievements. We have been revising our phonemes (sounds) and practicing our blending and reading skills daily, including reading some compound words like 'windmill' during our Phonics lessons. In Maths we have been learning about numbers that are greater than, less than or equal to each other. In Geography, we explored physical and human features. In Computing, we have learned about the component parts of a computer and used the mouse to design a picture in an app. In Art we have loved mixing primary colours and experimenting to make secondary colours. It was a pleasure to see so many families at our Parent Information meeting. Please see the website if you missed it. Books for pleasure will come home today and homework books on Monday.

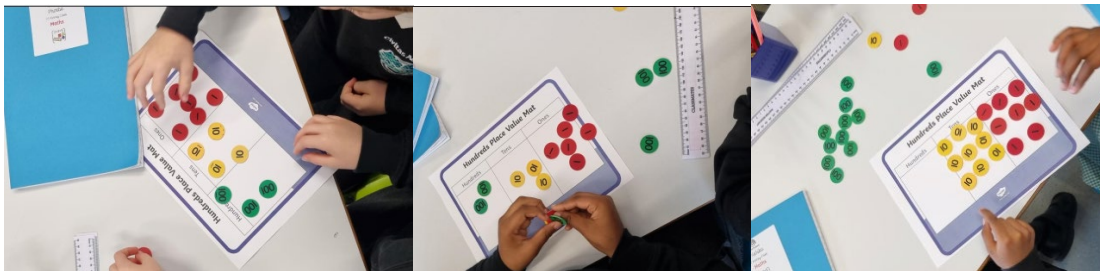
Year 2:

This week in Year 2, we have used last week's learning and our box up plans to start writing our very own narratives based on 'Angus rides the Goods Train'. In Maths, we focused on number lines investigating the intervals. Later, we compared objects and numbers using greater than and less than symbols. Year 2 kickstarted their first History lesson learning about the importance of voting, especially in the UK – we all took part in voting to watch a short clip then discussed what makes a vote fair. We may have some future politicians in Year 2! For Science, we continued exploring animals and plants in different habitats thinking about their adaptability to survive in each habitat. On Thursday, we loved seeing lots of Year 2 rock their jeans for 'Jeans for Genes' Day! Thank you to those who were able to attend Parent Drop-in meetings this week – it was lovely to see you. For those who were unable to attend – the relevant information is available on the school website. Homework books will be handed out on Monday. Have a lovely weekend!

Key Stage 2

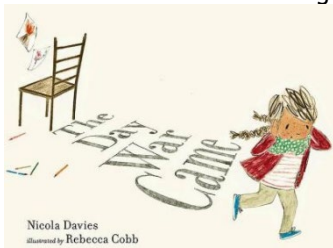
Year 3:

This week in English, we started exploring and identifying features of a narrative. We explore a variety of texts to support our learning. We looked at WAGOLL's and began to box up our work ready for our big write next week! In Math, we continued working with place value. We used place value charts to support our learning when finding 1, 10 and 100 more or less of a number. In History, we learnt more about the underground railroad. We found out what the underground railroad was and how it was used to help enslaved people find freedom in the northern states of America. In Spanish we have been learning to introduce ourselves to each other, next week we will be learning to count to 10.



Year 4:

This week we have finished writing our diary entries in English about being kidnapped by yetis which links to our whole class reading book "The Abominables". We are continuing our place value lessons in Maths and soon are moving on the addition and subtraction.



We will start on our new book "The day the war came" next week which will be linked to our Global Learning topic – Peace and Conflict. We are still working on sounds in science, and we are very excited about our recent delivery from the Reading Museum which will help us with our history topic "The Romans". More pictures of that next week!

Year 5:

In Year 5, we had a wonderful week filled with exciting learning experiences. In maths, we gained skills in rounding numbers to the nearest 10s, 100s, and 1000s up to 1,000 0000. In English, we engaged in creative writing tasks where we planned, wrote, and edited diary entries based on our class novel, *The Boy Who Harnessed the Wind*. In science, the students learned about the Earth's rotation and revolution in the solar system through exciting experiments. We gained a deeper understanding of how the Earth revolves and rotates on its axis, leading to the occurrence of day and night. In geography, we expanded our knowledge of South America by using the atlas to locate Brazil and its neighbouring countries. We appreciate the attendance of all parents in the teacher meeting. For those who missed the event, the presentation will be available on our website.

Year 6:

This week in English we planned, wrote and edited our narrative writing inspired by our text *The Lion and the Unicorn*. In maths we came to the end of our place value unit and began our new unit using the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division). We enjoyed our first history lesson of the year; learning about the start of the British Empire. During the lesson the children examined a portrait of Elizabeth I - identifying hidden symbols and explaining what they might mean. In Science we deepened our understanding of light and learnt how our eyes work. We drew labelled diagrams of a cross-section of the eye; we can explain the functions of the iris, pupil, optic nerve and retina.
