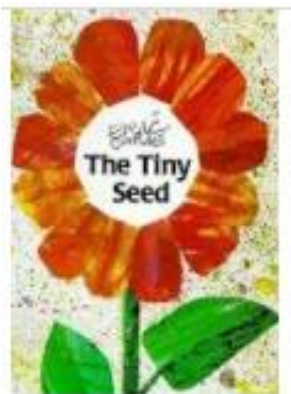
## What have we been learning this week?

### Reception

In Reception this week we have begun our new topic of 'Growing and Changing'. This week we have been reading the story "The Tiny Seed" by Eric Carle and through this story we have been learning about the life cycle of a flowering plant. We enjoyed planting sunflower seeds this week and we look forward to seeing these grow! After we planted our sunflowers we wrote instructions for how to plant a flower and we learnt about and labelled the different parts of a flowering plant.

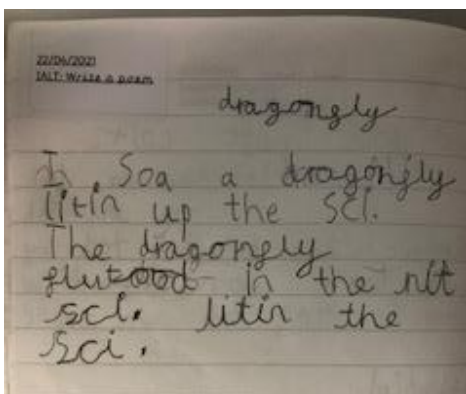
In Maths we have been learning to use ten frames to count numbers beyond 10. We have been identifying teen numbers as such 10 and more. We have also practised estimating this week.

We have enjoyed making and painting fruit and vegetables out of salt dough and have worked on our fine motor skills by picking up peas with a peg.



### Key Stage 1

Year 1 have started reading the book 'Slug Needs a Hug' by Jeanne Willis and have learnt about rhyming words. They used these rhyming words to form their own poems just like the book.



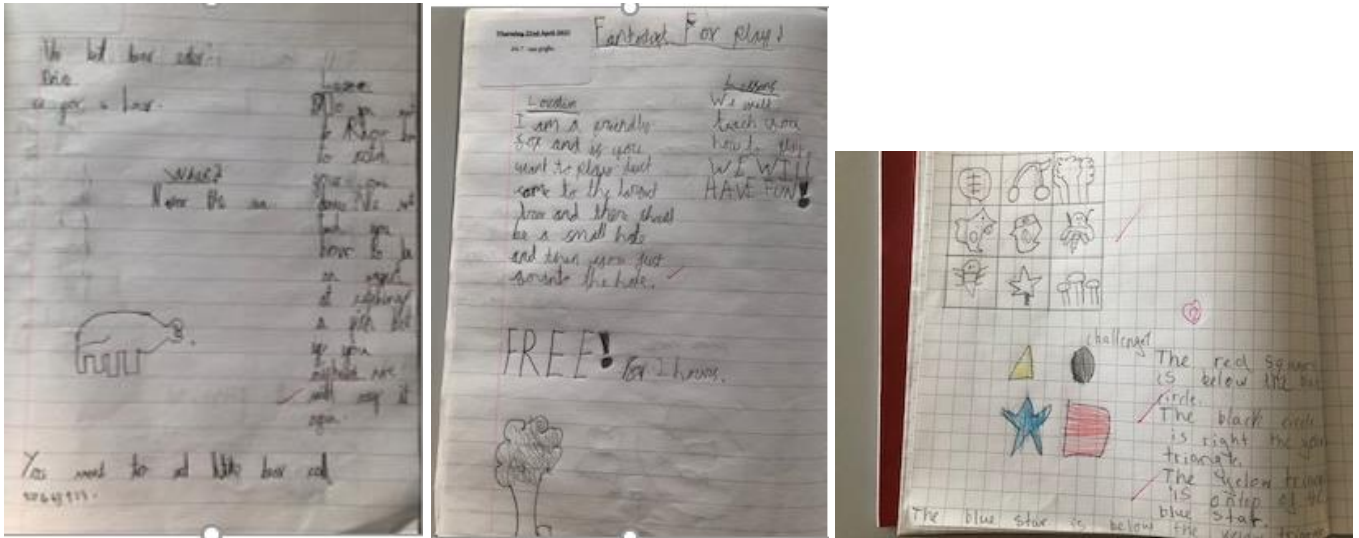
In Maths, they have been practicing their counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. This will help them learn how to do multiplication and division. This is a picture of Miss Pearse's lovely display to support the children's learning.

Their topic is minibeasts. This week they learnt about David Attenborough, a significant person who teaches us about the creatures on Earth. In art they learnt how to make symmetrical butterflies using printing techniques.

**Year 2** have started reading the book 'Wild' by Emily Hughes. They have found out that the different animals in the forest have taught a little girl how to speak, eat and play. They have been writing adverts from the animals and challenging themselves to use prefixes.

In Maths, they have started learning about position and direction. This has involved lots of practical activities such as directing friends around the class and playground and making board games.

Year 2 have also started learning about the location of jungles around the world for their 'Forests' topic.



### Key Stage 2

**Year 3** have begun our "Meet the Artists" topic and learnt about two different clothes designers. These were Ann Lowe and Edith Head. We also learnt about the different parts of the flowering plants and the functions of these. We now know that the roots are for absorbing water/nutrients and keeping the plant anchored to the ground. The stem is for transporting water to the leaves and for holding the plant upright. The leaves use sunlight and carbon dioxide to make food for the plant. The flower is brightly coloured to attract insects.

**Year 4** have started our Topic on the Romans this week! We were lucky enough to explore some real Roman coins, please see attached pictures. This has been linked to our English writing, which the children have been really excited about. During topic lessons, we started to explore the Roman Empire and their soldiers. We really enjoyed exploring maps of Europe to analyse the spread of the Roman Empire through 800BC - 305AD.



**Year 5** - we kicked off our new topic – Space - finding out the relative sizes of the Earth, Sun and Moon and their distance from each other. We were shocked to learn that the Earth is approximately 7,900 miles in diameter whereas the Sun is a whopping 880,000 miles in diameter! We've taken a tour around the International Space Station with Tim Peake and investigated how shadows are formed and why they move. The weather must have known we planned to investigate shadows as it shone brightly...anyone for more shadow investigations next week?
