Science

Forces— In this unit the pupils will be learning about gravity, and looking at how friction works with air resistance, water resistance and friction between surfaces. See if your child can measure the different ways that something moves on different surfaces.

Working Scientifically— This is all about using a range of scientific skills including: observing, measuring, recording, interpreting and evaluating. See if your child can set up their own investigation.

PSHE

Relationships—This unit is all about knowing yourself and how you act with others. See if you can create a self portrait with all of your different positive characteristics then share with a family member and ask them to add some. Are there some that others see that you don't?

Changing Me—During this unit the children will look at the changes they will go through. Ask them to write a note to their future self with all their dreams and goals.

Maths

Shape - The children can identify different shapes around where they live. During this unit will be exploring different angles so encourage the children to spot different acute, obtuse or reflex angles.

Decimals - Encourage your child to use their understanding of adding decimals to create a shopping list. See if they can stay in a budget and even accompany you on the weekly shop!

Negative Numbers - Ask your child to keep track of the temperatures at the moment. Could they research some of the low temperatures from winter and compare them to now? See if they can present this on a number line.

Global Learning

Consider your 'human rights'. What would life be like if we had no rights? How could we ensure every one's rights are met?



Writing

Playscript: Think about what it might be like for someone to be on trial for a crime. Create a list of emotions someone might be feeling.

Explanation: research the punishments throughout the Victorian era and what crimes someone may have committed.

Narrative: research Tom Avery. Who is he? What stories did he create? What was his inspiration?

Instructions: find some instructions for a game, recipe or furniture building. What do all these instructions have? What parts are the most use-

The Arts

Sculpture: Create a paper sculpture on a piece of Art around Reading. Google images to help you. Create a fact file on why you think this piece of Art is beautiful or not.

Humanities

History: Create a poster showing the differences between punishments in the past and present.
