

What have we been learning this week?

Reception

This week in literacy, our focus text was "Kipper's Holiday." We have been learning all about the seaside, different types of holidays that people go on and we have written postcards. In Maths we had great fun learning to make and follow treasure maps, as well as planning and creating obstacle courses. We have made seaside pictures using sand, have practiced our scissor and cutting skills through cutting and sticking items into a suitcase and have been pegging pairs of socks on a washing line, whilst counting in twos. We also learnt about beach safety and made beach safety posters.





Key Stage 1

Year 1 have been creating their own posters to advertise our town, Reading. In maths we have continued learning about time. In topic we are learning all about mural art and have explored creations by Banksy. We have also been inspired by the wonderful Oxford Road mural and created our own murals in art.



Year 2 have been writing poems this week about Grace O'Malley focusing on rhyming words. They have made progress since the last time we did rhyming words and more of the children are being creative with their poems. In Maths they have been recapping how to find fractions of shapes and amounts. In the afternoon, year 2 have learnt how to use maps and directional vocabulary for the human and physical geography in Reading. Year 2 looked amazing on pirate day and it was a full packed day of pirate themed activities.



Key Stage 2

Year 3

This week in Year 3, we have continued our learning about the Iron Age and have looked at the artefacts and houses created during this time. In PSHE we have been learning about friendships and how to resolve conflicts in those friendships to build good relationships that benefit both people. In English, we wrote a story based on "Cave Baby" and made a creative change to the character or setting and later published our story to be displayed in the school. In maths, finished learning about grams and kilograms and are now learning about litres and millilitres and how to measure capacity of various jugs and cylinders and the volume of liquid they can hold. We had a fantastic time in sports practising stretching and different poses.





Year 4

In Year 4, we are pleased to announce our production of "Year 4 Change for Climate Change!" video is complete! This video was to show our parents and the people outside of the school all the amazing learning the Year 4s have done this half term on the Climate crisis, how we can stop it and who the famous names are in the Climate Change movement. 
In English this week we were writing to our Local MP about our concerns about the environment around Reading and offering advice on how we can make Reading "greener". In maths this week, we have finished our small topic on translation and movement on a graph and are now moving onto a consolidation week in maths, covering anything we missed or found a little harder this year.



As we get closer to finishing this year, Miss Parry and Miss Edwards would like to express that is has been a pleasure teaching your children this year and we will miss them greatly. Year 5:

In maths this week we have been using our skills to help us tell the time and work out the difference between volume and capacity. Does anyone remember what this is? During English we have become mini authors. We finished reading our world of the Maya booklet and started to prepare our own! We have picked four categories that we found interesting, and we have started to create our own booklet. We will finish publishing them next week. Some are going to go up on our Mayan display and the others are going to be kept for our current year 4's to read next year when they study the Maya. During our afternoon lessons we have been focusing on science! We have learnt about different materials and their properties; we created a table to help us compare similarities and differences between two materials. We also learnt all about different solvents and how they mix in water - we were lucky enough to test these out for ourselves! We loved seeing the bicarbonate of soda fizzing as it hit the water! The solvents we used to mix with water were sand, salt, bicarbonate of soda, sugar and cornflour. We let the solvents settle in the water before mixing them with a spoon to see what happened if we forced a reaction!





This year has gone so quickly, and we can't believe it is the summer holidays next Wednesday. Mr Williams and Mrs Rapley would like to say how proud we are of all the children in year 5 and all their hard work in what has been a tricky year at school! We have loved teaching you all and we hope you have a lovely and safe summer holidays – see you all in September!
